Alan Scholes has been a full-time, faith-supported staff member with Cru for more than 40 years. His many assignments over the years have included Campus Director, Coordinator of Campus Literature, United States Training Coordinator, and Professor at the International School of Theology.

Alan is currently the Associate Director of the International School Project (ISP). ISP has a ministry of pre-evangelism, evangelism, discipleship, and movement building with public-school educators in various countries of Latin America, Europe, the Middle East, Asia, and the former Soviet Union.

Dr. Scholes holds three earned master's degrees, and received a Ph.D. in Theology from the Claremont School of Theology. He is the author of three books, co-author of two others, and has published dozens of articles, both popular and scholarly.

For the past 35 years Alan has guest lectured in college and university classrooms throughout the United States as well as Europe, Africa, Asia, Latin America, and the former Soviet Union. He has served as the chief theologian for several curricula developed for use in the former Soviet Union and around the world including "Crossroads," "Story of Jesus," "Foundations," and "Dream Makers/Dream Breakers" a drug and alcohol abuse-prevention curriculum aimed at Jr. High age students.

Alan is known for creative approaches to teaching including use of many clips from Hollywood movies and TV series, and for making practical applications to personal life and ministry.

Alan and his wife, Jan, have three married children and seven grandchildren. They live in the Denver suburb of Parker, Colorado.
