What This Course Is About

Have you ever thought of the Old Testament as a **training manual to equip you for life and ministry?** That is exactly why God gave you these thirty-nine books!

The Old Testament is a unified book that tells an ancient story about God establishing his ideal for the world (Law), how that ideal was lost (Prophets) and then restored at least in part (Writings).

How to use the Old Testament in your own life and your ministry.

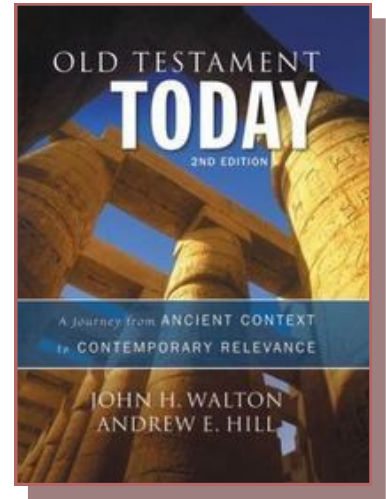
What You Need To Read
