**How to find** encouragement and hope in the pages of the Old Testament.


How to use the Old Testament in your own life and your ministry.

- $\Rightarrow$  All answers are to be typed.
- $\Rightarrow$  First, type the question.

# How You Will Be Graded



#### Quizzes and Exam.

- $\Rightarrow$  There are 10 quizzes worth 10 points each, totaling 100 points = 50% of your grade.
- ⇒ There is a Final Exam worth 40 points = 20% of your grade. The final will be online and objective. It will be open for one week after the completion of the lecture portion of the course. The questions will be based on the lectures.

#### Ministry Reflection.

⇒ There 10 ministry reflections worth 2 points each, totaling 20 points = 10% of your grade. Each reflection is to be between 250 and 500 words and must show an application of the lecture material to your ministry. You will also post 3 critiques per session of other students' posts.
